SECURITY DOOR

Our security door, located just as you enter the classroom hallway, is locked between pick-up and drop-off time each day.

Office staff can buzz you in from the outside. Push the door to open it from the inside.

REGISTRATION

Applications are available online for the coming year at www.wasatchpreschool.org and in the office on January 9th 2017. Returning students will find forms in their child's file folder at pick-up time.

The deadline for registering returning students is February

1st, 2017. All children and siblings of children already attending Wasatch Preschool and members of Wasatch Presbyterian church register by this deadline and get first choice of available classes. The deadline for new students is March 1st, 2017.

We place students into available spaces in random order until all openings are taken and notify parents of results shortly after each deadline. New Waiting Lists begin after the program is full.

Please remember: we guarantee returning students a place in the school and usually the number of days desired but there are limited openings both morning and afternoon. Some families who want to morning classes may get an afternoon placement and others who prefer

afternoon may be placed in the morning.

TOURS OF SCHOOL

Tours of our school are every Tuesday at 10:00 am.

DRESS FOR THE COLD

We remind you to dress your children to play outdoors. They play outside unless the health department recommends we stay indoors or when snow falls from the playground roof.
